REQUEST FOR INPUT

Owner: City of St. Catharines c/o Vincent Covatta, Project Supervisor,
Transportation and Environmental Services (TES)

TES staff requested input from the Committee regarding the colour and profile of new shingles to be installed on the pavilion, band shell, and facilities building at Montebello Park. A heritage permit is not required for the work. Staff's presentation included a photographic chronology of the structures in question, as well as samples of modern asphalt shingles.

Historic photographs presented suggest that a smooth, sheet-style material existed on the band shell roof circa 1920. Later photographs show red 3-tab shingles (circa 1944). With respect to the pavilion, the shingle profile appears to have previously been square tab (circa 1937). In 2003, the shingles of all three buildings were replaced with the red 3-tab shingles that exist today. Photographs of roofing work done in 2003 appear to show remnants of what is believed to be the original roofing material on the band shell – an oil cloth or canvas material. Staff suggested that this type of roofing material is no longer produced.

While no motion could be made, the Committee expressed its preference for a laminated square shingle in cottage red for all three buildings.
