Dear Mayor Sendzik and City Council members;

My name is Lieutenant (Navy) Aaron Bean and I am the commanding officer of Royal Canadian Sea Cadet corps 358 Sir Isaac Brock here in St. Catharines. Sea Cadets is a free youth program for people aged 12-18. We parade on Wednesday nights from 1830-2130 from September-early June. The aim of sea cadets is to develop in youth, the attributes of good citizenship and leadership; promote physical fitness; and stimulate the interest of youth in the activities of the Canadian Forces.

Our current parade location is the polish legion located at 294 Vine st. St. Catharines. As you are all more than likely aware, the legion is being demolished soon and rebuilt in the future. The polish legion will be welcoming us back once they are rebuilt; but in the meantime; we will not have a home. This is the reason for this letter. We would like to temporarily relocate to the St. Catharines Museum & Welland Canals Centre at 1932 Welland Canals Parkway. The Room rate at the museum is \$47.30 per hour plus HST (\$53.14). We would require it 3 hours a week for 38 weeks (September-June) which would work out to \$6057.96 for the year. As a not-for-profit youth organization in your community; we are requesting that the rental fee be waived or subsidized for our 2022-2023 training year.
